### **Identified barriers to educational achievement**

Bideford College has identified the following as barriers for some of the pupils currently in receipt of Pupil Premium:

- Access to extra-curricular activities - educational experiences such as trips, music lessons and participation in physical activities
- Attendance
- Parental engagement with school - especially regarding attendance at information and workshop evenings and completion of homework
- Uniform, PE kit and equipment
- The number of pupils who are in receipt of Pupil Premium and also on the SEND register for cognition and learning
- Behaviour – pupils with specific social and emotional needs which affect their learning

**How will Bideford College measure the impact of Pupil Premium spending?**

To monitor progress on attainment the usual cycle of data collection and the monitoring and tracking of the cohort's attainment, will be used to inform pupil progress and enable the early identification of need, support and appropriate intervention. Review meetings will take place after each data collection, this enables the college to review the impact of actions taken and will plan for the funding will be specifically allocated over the next half term. Heads of Faculty, Heads of House and KS Assistant Principals are responsible for keeping up to date spreadsheets of all PP students funding.
