Geography	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Grow a cactus and pay attention to the adaptation that helps it survive in hot desert environments. See if you can keep it alive before your GCSE exams as a reminder of how they are adapted to suit the poor-quality soil, lack of water and how they defend against predators. You can do the same with a Bromeliad or other plants that derive from the rainforest. These are often best kept in bathrooms due to their love of humid conditions and need for regular watering.
